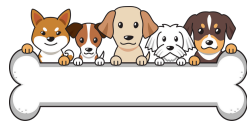

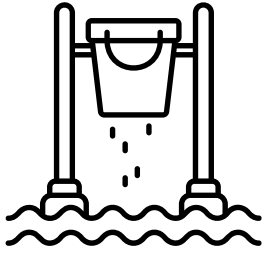


# Gatherings at the Park
