\$10. Males and Spayed Females \$20. Un-spayed Females

You <u>MUST</u> show your proof of Rabies Vaccination before you can purchase your tags.

Tags are a one time thing. If you lose your tag, you can purchase a replacement for a small fee of \$3. Your dog must be kept in your control at all times and must remain on your property unless leashed and in your control.

200th Anniversary



The Founder of Bojestown.

Born in 1789 in Bedford, New Hampshire. He came to Southwest Miramichi in 1821. On October 8, 1823, Mr. Boies bargained with Christopher Young for the sale of Burnt Land Brook grant, now known as Boiestown for the sum of forty pounds. Deed was registered March 3, 1824. The rest is History.
